Update on Development in the 200 Block of Conant Street

Following a public hearing on February 21, Maumee City Council accepted an offer from Monnette’s Market to purchase city-owned property in the 200 block of Conant Street. The locally owned grocer has agreed to pay \$306,000 for the land, which has been vacant since 2004. A concept plan has been submitted estimating that the newly constructed produce

market would be approximately 7,000 to 9,000 square feet; however, the city will implement final design approval.

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HIGHLIGHTED BUSINESS OF THE MONTH: You Can Be An Artist

Artist and business owner Liz Earley purchased You Can Be an Artist last year. The studio, which is located at 415 Conant St, offers open art classes that are perfect for bachelorette or birthday parties or just an evening out to get creative with paint.

Liz and her fellow instructors teach multiple art classes throughout the week and each two- to three-hour class is based on a predetermined image that is listed online. Participants of any skill level are welcome to join, and Liz is confident that anyone who tries their hand at painting will experience a successful outcome.

“What I really like seeing are the different styles,” Liz said. “I think it’s incredible to see how personalities come out - I think it’s neat that several people can paint something from the same instruction, but they come out totally different.”

In addition to open classes, You Can Be an Artist also supports fundraisers - either donating a gift basket or hosting an event in which a portion of the proceeds benefit a designated organization. The business also accommodates private parties with a minimum of 10 people.
