The Maumee Community Band will perform from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. and Johnny Rodriguez will provide live entertainment from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.

The fireworks will be launched at approximately 10:00 p.m. from the Fort Meigs Memorial Bridge.

The Fort Meigs Memorial Bridge will be closed to vehicle and pedestrian traffic from 8:00 to 11:30 p.m., and Conant Street south of the Anthony Wayne Trail will also close to vehicle traffic at 8:00 p.m.

Beginning at 5:00 p.m., parking will be prohibited in the 200 and 300 blocks of Conant Street. At 9:00 p.m., parking will be prohibited from Ford to Broadway streets.

The 100 block of East Wayne Street and the community parking lot will also be closed at 2:00 p.m.

Georgette’s Grounds & Gifts

Georgette Engler was a mother, a visionary, a caregiver and one strong-willed woman. She and her husband, Roy, raised five children with disabilities at a time when others often institutionalized those who were different.

In 1950, the Maumee couple founded Sunshine Children’s Home to help other families care for their children with disabilities and to help “bring a little bit of sunshine” into the lives of these children through loving care in a clean, home-like setting.

Today, residential options remain the core of its operations, but Sunshine offers vocational, clinical, recreational, and other services as well to more than 400 people with disabilities in Northwest Ohio and their families. The men, women and children that [Sunshine](#) supports live, work and play on their terms.
